

9'-6". Fatima Amaya Diaz broke the long-standing school record in the Discus with a throw of 117'-9". The 4x100m relay team, which consists of Katie Turray, Taylor Rivers, Sarah Pagan, and Renee Agyemang, gave the National District teams problems all year. They are on the verge of breaking 50 seconds in the 4x100m relay. Cliodhna Collins and Amaya Diaz won First Team All-District honors in the Discus and Shot Put, respectively, Amaya Diaz qualifying for the 6A Outdoor State Championship.

The boy team was highlighted by Mosa Shamat's High Jump talent with a jump of 6'-0" that qualified him for the 6A Outdoor State Championship. This season also highlighted Tobey Phinney in the hurdles. He was in the hunt to win a district title before an injury slowed him down in the 110m hurdles. Dustin Williams rounded out the year with a Second Team All-District in the Shot Put.

Softball

The Justice Wolves reached several program milestones under first year head coach Jack Deschauer. First, the Wolves scored 17 runs against two-time state semifinalist Hayfield, the most runs Hayfield had given up in a game in at least eight seasons. The Wolves scored ten runs in one inning in that game, the most runs scored in an inning against Hayfield in at least five seasons. This year's varsity squad doubled its runs per game output and cut its runs given up numbers significantly. Junior Shortstop Wren Pringle was also named First Team All-District and to the All-Region Team; the first time a Justice player has been named first team in several seasons.
